It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers subject to him.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Children's Liturgy of the Word

First Sunday of Lent - February 18, 2024 Liturgical Color: **PURPLE**

Parents:

We invite you to spend some time discussing this weekend's readings with your children. By helping them understand God's word, you will help build a strong foundation of faith!

Theme: During Lent, we focus on sacrifice and change. We remember how much Jesus loves us and the sacrifice he made for us.

Reading (Genesis 9:8-15)

In today's first reading, the great flood is over, and Noah's family has returned to dry land. God makes a covenant (a promise) to Noah and his family.

Gospel (Mark 1:12-15)

Today's Gospel tells us about Jesus right after his baptism in the Jordan River. He was almost ready to begin preaching the Good News, but there was one more thing he needed to do.

Discussion

- In our first reading, we hear of God's covenant, which means promise. What promise does God make? What is the sign of his promise?
- Where did Jesus go for 40 days after his baptism?
- What do you think he was doing there?
- When Jesus returned, what was he ready to do?
- During Lent, we are asked to sacrifice and change, like Jesus did. What is our promise during Lent for sacrifice and/or change?
